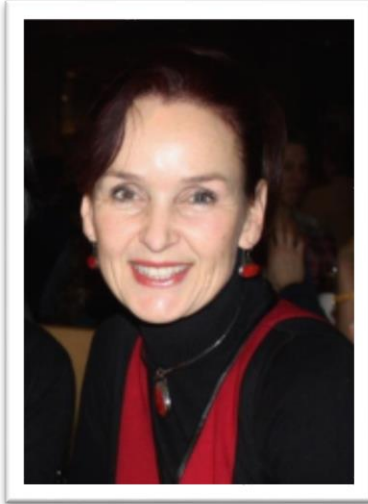


District 25 - PECCS (Professional Educators and Child Care Staff) 2016-2017 Executive

Ibtisaam Abboud, Treasurer



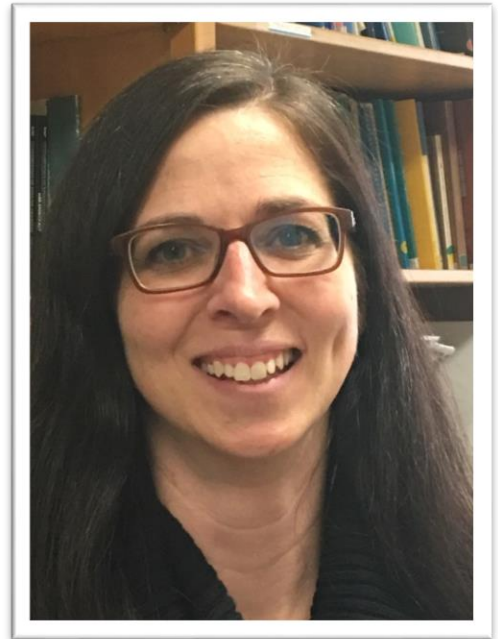
